❖ About the Seminar:

Indian Philosophers' Day is celebrated to commemorate the contributions of Indian philosophers, particularly on the birthday of Adi Shankaracharya, also known as Śaṅkara Jayanti (2nd may, 2025). This day is observed to broaden the understanding and appreciation of Indian knowledge systems and philosophical thought. While there isn't a universally fixed date, it is often celebrated around the time of Śaṅkara Jayanti, which falls in the month of April or May. For instance, in 2023, it was celebrated on April 25th. In some instances, it's also associated with the birth anniversary of other prominent philosophers like Ramanujacharya. The Indian Council of Philosophical Research (ICPR) is involved in organizing events and programs to mark this day, encouraging institutions to host seminars, workshops, and lectures.

➤ **Scope as per the ICPR Guideline:**

In order to provide an opportunity for scholars to express their views and interact with other scholars, ICPR organizes both National and International Seminars every year on a variety of themes and topics in Philosophy and interdisciplinary studies. It also gives grant to Philosophy Departments of Indian Universities and research Institutions to organize Seminars/symposia/workshops/dialogues etc. The council has linked up its publication program with the seminars in such a manner that all important papers presented can be published by the council, if found suitable. It may be mentioned that some of the very outstanding papers of the seminars are published in the council's journal viz., JICPR. Every year the council receives a large number of requests from the Universities, Research Organizations for partial assistance for organizing seminars and ICPR supports 25 to 50 such seminars annually.

➤ **Target group of participants:**

Early-career researchers M. Phil. Students, Ph. D. students, Post doc or other young researchers, (College/University Faculty), Undergraduate students and Postgraduate students in the fields of Sanskrit & Philosophy and others fields (basically Social Sciences).

▪ **How to reach the Venue:**

▪ **Application process:**

To apply for participation in the seminar (i) fill-up the Google form link provided below, (ii) submit the abstract following the title, author(s) name, designation, address in the same link within midnight (11:59 p.m.) **13th July, 2025 (Sunday)**. Applications will be evaluated by the organizers. Only selected candidates will be informed by email for presentation.

Call for Paper:

The seminar invites original and unpublished research papers related to the topic of seminar (any field from Indian Philosophy, Indian Ethics and any others fields or subjects as related to Indian ethical thought) for presentation from Teachers, Academicians, Research Scholars and Students. Interested participants are requested to send an Abstract (in Sanskrit or English or Bengali) of **300 words** within 13th July, 2025 (up to 11.59 p.m.). The Abstract should be a summary of the research and is expected to meet the academic standards. Full length paper (not more than **3000 words**) is to be submitted in word and pdf format.

The abstract as well as full paper shall be arranged as:

- **Title of the paper: Bold**
- **Author's name and designations along with the institution's name**
- **Keywords: 4 to 6.**
- **Text: Sanskrit (kokila, font size14)**
 English (Times New Roman, font size
 12) Bengali (Avro
 Keyboard/Kalpurush, font size 14)
- **Lines Space: 1.5 spaces.**
- **Margins: 1.5 inch (2.5cm) all side justified.**
- **Word limit: Maximum 300 words for abstract and maximum 3000 words for the full paper.**
- **References must be in the APA or MLA format.**
