The 4-year B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Honours) Programme shall be for a minimum duration of eight (8) consecutive semesters of six (6) months each, i.e., four years with or without research. The 3-year B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(MDC) Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (6) consecutive semesters of six (6) months each, i.e., three years. The odd semester starts ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year, subject to change as per further government circulars.

ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE AUDIT (AAA)
